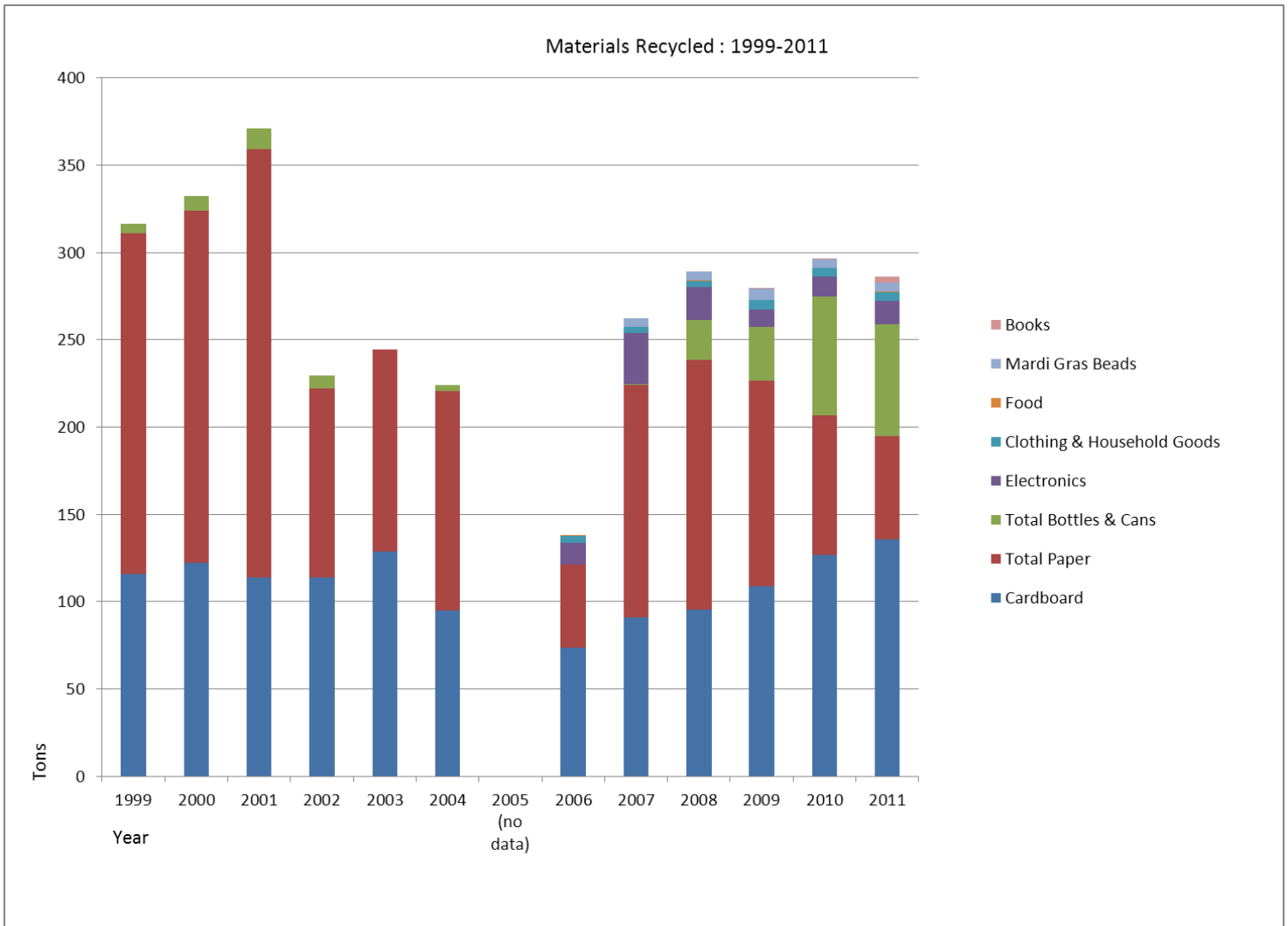


Tulane Uptown Campus Recycling, 1999-2012

The tables below show annual amounts of materials (in tons) handled by Tulane Recycling on the Uptown campus. It also shows the destinations of these materials—where we take them! It does not include specialized materials recycled within programs or departments, such as used motor oil recycled by Facilities or yard waste used as mulch on campus. It does not include construction materials recycled as part of Tulane’s LEED green building efforts, which total hundreds of tons of materials such as metals and concrete. As the uptown campus sends an estimated 3,000 tons of waste to the landfill, our recycling rate is about 10%.
